

STREET COMMITTEE MEETING
July 1, 2015

A special meeting of the City of Jackson Street Committee was held in City Hall at 11:30 a.m. on July 1, 2015 with the following persons in attendance: Street Committee member Dave Cushman, City Administrator Jennifer Bromeland, Street Superintendent George Tauer and Recording Secretary Dave Maschoff.

REVIEW AND APPROVE LOWEST PROPOSAL TO REPAIR EROSION HILL

City Administrator Bromeland distributed two proposals obtained by Street Superintendent George Tauer to repair settlement issues occurring on the street commonly referred to as "Erosion Hill". She also distributed a recent picture taken of the area in which the settlement is apparent. Bromeland reported that according to Tauer, the project was completed in 2011, and there was only a one year warranty. She said the settlement issues weren't apparent until 2013.

Bromeland said the cost to make the repair to "Erosion Hill" will be paid for using Street Department funds.

Tauer said funds would be available in the Street Department budget to make the repair. He said \$75,000 was allocated for sealcoating in the Street Department budget this year, but it's not anticipated that entire amount will be used, so funds would be available to make the repair on Erosion Hill. Tauer explained the area that needs to be repaired has settled four inches.

It was the consensus to recommend to the City Council that the lowest proposal from BKC Construction, Incorporated be accepted in the amount of \$8,847.75 to address settlement issues on Erosion Hill.

REVIEW AND DISCUSS NAMING OF EROSION HILL

Bromeland said Mayor Walter asked about the naming of "Erosion Hill". She said it was an issue that was discussed before she started her duties as City Administrator.

Bromeland said City staff researched the City Council minutes and found that the Council discussed naming the street at their meeting on December 20, 2011.

She said the Council had directed City staff to make arrangements for having the citizens of Jackson submit suggested names for the street and to award some type of prize for the winning entry which would be decided upon by the Council. She asked whether the City Council wanted to have a contest, or just name the street.

Cushman asked what address residents along Erosion Hill get their mail delivered to them.

Tauer said everybody along Erosion Hill currently has an Ashley Street address. He said there were four residents that live along the street known as "Erosion Hill". Tauer said the Post Office should be contacted to see if renaming the street will require also changing those residents' mailing addresses. He said that may have been why the residents along that street dropped the proposal to rename the street. Tauer said those residents have had a mailing address of East Ashley for quite some time. He said a sign could be posted that shows "Erosion Road" so everyone is aware of where it is.

Bromeland asked City Clerk Maschoff to contact the Post Office to find out if the residents' along "Erosion Hill" would need to change their mailing address if the street was officially renamed. She said she would include that information in a memo to the City Council.

Bromeland said according to the December 20, 2011 City Council minutes, some of the suggestions at the time included the road be named Ashley Ridge Road or Ashley Lane.

REVIEW TIMELINE FOR ANNUAL STRIPING OF CROSSWALKS AND PARKING STALLS

Street Superintendent Tauer reported the paint for striping crosswalks and parking stalls has arrived. He said he has been working with Lindsay Chapman who has been administering a grant through SHIP for painting the crosswalks by the schools all one color.

Tauer noted the storm clean-up has put the Street Department about eight days behind schedule. He's said he anticipates the striping of the crosswalks and parking stalls will be done in the next couple of weeks.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
